
### **SCHOOL PHILOSOPHY**

### **DEVELOPING OUR STRATEGIC ACTION PLAN**

Established in 1927, the Bolton Central School District's current mission for students is "to strive for academic excellence and remarkable experiences in a supportive community, which will exceed all expectations." The Bolton Central School District combines clear academic goals with a talented and imaginative staff, very good community participation and a wide assortment of opportunities for children.

The Board of Education's ongoing goal is to ensure the best educational opportunities for children enrolled at Bolton Central School in an environment that is safe and supportive while promoting engagement and achievement. This philosophy inspired the District to look ahead and involve everyone in developing initiatives that support our children and their future.

In the spring of 2013, the Bolton Central School Board of Education developed the Strategic Planning Committee. The initial steps were conducted by an independent consultant and involved the defining of our District's mission, values and strategic goals. This process involved the gathering of information and facts from the District, as well as opinions and ideas from over 70 people in seven focus groups who were directly involved with the District.

Collecting these opinions was considered important for two reasons: first, the collective thoughts of many people makes for more thoughtful, thorough and sound decisions; and second, including many people in the decision process ensures transparency and a wider support base for project outcomes. As the Bolton Central School District Board of Education sets

policy and provides direction in the years ahead, the aspirations created by these focus group members will be a valuable resource. Gaining the thoughts, opinions and support of the community is crucial for the future success of the School District.

The planning brought together school and community members to develop a blueprint for the future that included strategic objectives, action plans and the measurement tools needed to chart progress. The focus groups included: Board of Education members, Community members, Parents, Students, Instructional Staff, Non-Instructional Staff and Administrative Staff. To ensure that all members of our school community could have their voices heard, an online survey was also made available for anyone unable to attend a focus group meeting.

Discussion was initiated and driven by responses to a series of questions. Prior to the end of the sessions, participants were asked to prioritize their responses to selected questions on the basis of their perceived importance to the success of the District. Following the focus group sessions, the consultant worked to consolidate the results and the following recommendations were presented to the Board of Education and the public in attendance:

- 1- Focus on Academics/Raise Expectations
- 2- Increase Community Involvement
- 3- Student Enrollment

From these recommendations an Action Plan was developed. (See the Action Plan on page 8.)

### **RULES FOR ATTENDING ATHLETIC CONTESTS**

#### Please follow these rules:

- 1. At all athletic contests, coaches and advisors will be in charge of cheerleaders and players.
- 2. Chaperones from both home and visiting schools attending the activity will have full charge of spectators.
- 3. Visiting teams, spectators and referees are guests. Sportsmanlike conduct will be the responsibility of each member of the faculty, student body, and Bolton fans.
- 4. Students are not to leave their seats except between games and at halftime.
- 5. Students attending from Grade 6 or below must be accompanied by a parent (or adult) and remain with that parent (or adult) during the game (a student is not considered an adult for the purpose of this rule).
- 6. Refreshments will be served and consumed in the cafeteria at the following times: pregame, halftime, and intermission between games.
- 7. Smoking is strictly prohibited on school property.
- 8. Only those in uniform will be allowed on the playing surface at any time. Spectators are asked to avoid this area entirely.
- 9. Students are not allowed to leave the building and then reenter without prior permission. Once a student leaves the building, he/she may not be permitted to return.

10. Only players, coaches and managers will be allowed in the locker rooms. Others found there will be directed to leave.



- 11. Students and spectators will have access to bathrooms on the first floor only. These are located in the hallway adjacent to the gym.
- 12. Cordial host behavior is a reflection on Bolton Central School.
- 13. Spectators are not to be in the building outside the gymnasium area.
- 14. Spectators are to be seated and not stand in doorways.

It is important that we maintain our reputation as good hosts, good sports, and good spectators. No booing at any time. When foul shots are taken by any team, silence is the policy.

If a visiting teams' players or spectators conduct themselves poorly, exert every effort to maintain a calm and cool manner. We have chaperones at basketball games, who constantly remind the crowd of the need to be good sports, but they cannot do it alone. All of us become part of the process.

### **SCHOOL BUS SAFETY RULES & PROCEDURES**

The most important element of school bus transportation is the safety of students. In order to achieve a safe and efficient system, drivers must have the cooperation of all student riders.



- 1. Conduct on the school bus shall be of the same high standard as expected in the classroom. All school rules apply while students are on the bus. Students shall be courteous to fellow riders and their bus driver. Such acts as fighting, pushing, obscene talk or gestures will not be tolerated and will be cause for disciplinary action.
- 2. In order to maintain a strict time schedule,
- drivers cannot wait for students. Students must be ready and on time for boarding the bus each morning. PLEASE BE READY!
- 3. Students shall wait until the bus comes to a full stop before entering the roadway to board the bus or before leaving their seat to get off the bus.
- 4. Students should use extreme caution when getting on or off the bus. When crossing the highway, wait for the driver to signal to do so and cross 10 feet from the front of the bus.
- 5. Students shall always take a seat upon boarding a bus and remain seated at all times while the bus is in motion.

- 6. Students are to keep arms and heads inside of the bus at all times. Bus windows shall be kept shut unless permission to open them is given by the driver.
- 7. Smoking or the use of tobacco by students on the bus is strictly prohibited at all times. Eating of food, drinking of beverages, and taking medication is not permitted on the bus.
- 8. All items considered to be dangerous objects are prohibited on the bus. Also, bulky items, pets and animals should not be brought on the bus unless with permission granted ahead of time.
- 9. Buses must be kept clean at all times. Each

student has the duty and responsibility to see that he or she does not litter.

10. Students shall remain on the bus until it arrives at school or at home.

Drivers will not let students off upon request unless a pass is obtained from the Main Office for a change in riding status and given to the driver. A written parental request is required for any change from one bus to another or for a change in pick-up or drop-off point. Allowing for sufficient time to effect these changes ensures student safety.

11. The school bus driver is completely in charge when transporting students. All instructions given shall be followed and students should cooperate with the driver in any way they can.

These rules are made for the safety and benefit of all students. Unfortunately, there may be students who will not or do not abide by the rules. In the event of violations, the following disciplinary steps have been established:

- A. Verbal warning by the Bus Driver.
- B. Written referral to the principal for possible disciplinary action or suspension, with parental notification.
- C. Parent conference with school administrator in order to determine eligibility for continued transportation.
- D. School authorities may remove a student from bus privileges at any time if the offense is serious enough to warrant such action, regardless of the number of violations.
- E. Exclusive of the verbal warnings, parents will be notified of bus incidents and violations.

To assure bus safety, the New York State Education Department requires three school bus drills during each school year. The drills involve instruction as to the methods of exit from the bus in case of accident, location and use of fire extinguishers, and location of first aid kits.

Other safety factors such as crossing roadways, seating, behavior, as well as boarding and exiting exercises are reviewed and conducted.

#### **SCHOOL BREAKFAST**



School may be closed at any time of year due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances. When school is closed or dismissed early, all extracurricular activities and events for the remainder of that day and evening are also canceled, unless otherwise announced.



We are aware that emergency closings are often unexpected and parents may not be home to receive children. Thus, once school is in session we make every effort to stay open. In the event of a closing, we also want to make certain the Town Highway Department has the opportunity to properly clear and sand roads for buses and individuals picking up children at school.

Should school not open due to emergency or weather conditions, or in the event of a delayed opening or an early dismissal, the radio and television stations listed here will carry important information for you. Parents of BCS students who have completed the necessary information during registration, will receive a phone call from the BCS Automated Message System.

#### STUDENT INSURANCE

All student related, supervised activities are covered by an "excess coverage" student accident insurance plan. Claims for an injury must be submitted by the parents or guardians to their own health insurance carrier first. If the claim is not payable or is in excess of the amount payable, the balance is then submitted for supplemental payment under the school plan.

For any supervised school accident which requires medical attention, parents should notify the School Nurse. Failure on the part of the parent to meet certain clerical obligations, which are vital to the claim process, may result in unnecessary delays in payment of valid claims. Even if you are fairly certain your family insurance will cover a claim, the School Nurse should be notified.

### INFORMATION ON DISPENSING MEDICATION

In order to comply with New York State Regulations, the following procedures must be followed for all students requiring medication during school hours:

- A written physician's order to administer the medication must be provided to the Health Office.
- Signed written parental/guardian consent to administer the medication must be on file in the Health Office.
- The medication must be brought to the Health Office by the parent/guardian in the original labeled container including prescribed and overthe-counter (OTC) medications. Medications not in their original containers will not be accepted.
- The above orders are for both prescribed and overthe-counter medications including Tylenol, Advil, cough/cold medicines, etc.
- Students are NOT permitted to carry any medications (prescribed and/or OTCs) with them during school at any time.

Students requiring inhalers and/or emergency medications such as epi-pens require a signed written order from the physician and parent/guardian for permission for self-administration. Exceptions to allow these students to carry their medication are at the discretion of the Health Office.

If you have any questions regarding medications in the school setting, please contact the school nurse during regular school hours.

This information is available for review 24 hours a day, 7 days a week throughout the school year.

BCS students and parents will receive coded passwords, which will allow access to the information that each teacher enters pertaining to them. In cumulative fashion, PowerSchool lists all courses enrolled in, the assignments and tests, the grades and value to the overall class grade and grade point averages. It also is a great way to ensure that all assignments have been satisfactorily completed. In short, it's an electronic grade book and class register, which you can look at any time that you want.
