YOUR CONSTANT CONNECTION TO BOLTON CENTRAL SCHOOL!

Our website has a new look. If you haven't visited it in awhile, please check it out at www.boltoncsd.org. No matter where you are or what day or time it is, if you have access to the Internet, you have constant access to BCS. Through our school website, you are able to link to a variety of informative and interesting facets of the school. Staying informed about the latest news, educational programs and district information is just a "click" away.

Most important to parents of BCS students is POWERSCHOOL. Through a partnership with the Pearson Corporation, Bolton Central School became the first school in the North Country to be designated as a PowerSchool. This innovative program, again using Internet access from any computer, allows parents instant information, including grades, attendance, assignment and test information. This information is available for review 24 hours a day, 7 days a week throughout the school year.

BCS students and parents will receive coded passwords, which will allow access to the information that each teacher enters pertaining to them. In cumulative fashion, PowerSchool lists all courses enrolled in, the assignments and tests, the grades and value to the overall class grade and grade point averages. It also is a great way to ensure that all assignments have been satisfactorily completed. In short, it's an electronic grade book and class register, which you can look at any time that you want.

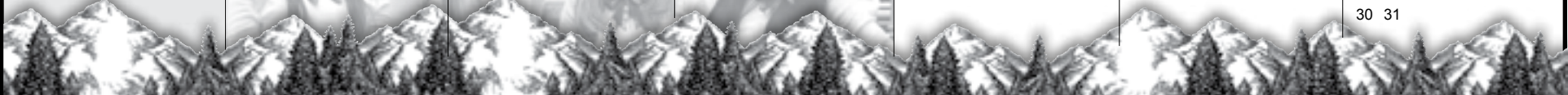
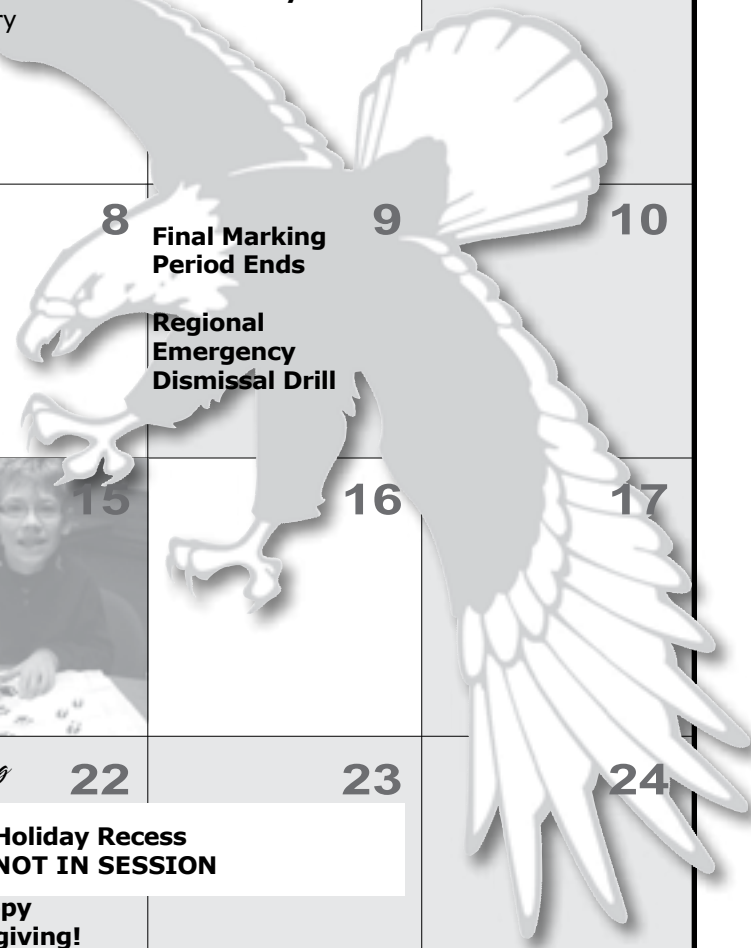

Common Core State Standards

The Common Core State Standards provide a consistent, clear understanding of what students are expected to learn, so teachers and parents know what they need to do to help them. These standards are designed to be robust and relevant to the current world, reflecting the knowledge and skills that our students need for success in college and careers.

The Standards set requirements not only for English language arts (ELA) but also for literacy in Social Studies, Science, Mathematics and associated subjects. Just as students must learn to read, write, speak, listen, and use language effectively in a variety of content areas, so too must the Standards specify the literacy skills and understandings required for college and career readiness in multiple disciplines. Literacy standards for grade 6 and above are predicated on teachers of ELA, history/social studies, science, and technical subjects using their content area expertise to help students

meet the particular challenges of reading, writing, speaking, listening, and language in their respective fields. It is important to note that the 6–12 literacy standards in social studies, science, and technical subjects are not meant to replace existing content standards in those areas but rather to supplement them. New York State and Bolton Central School is incorporating these standards into these subjects and has adopted them as content area literacy standards. As a natural outgrowth of meeting the charge to define college and career readiness, the Common Core Standards also lay out a vision of what it means to be a literate person in the 21st century. Indeed, the skills and understandings students are expected to demonstrate have wide applicability outside the classroom or workplace. Students who exceed the Common Core Standards readily undertake the close, attentive reading that is at the heart of understanding and enjoying challenging work. They habitually

perform the critical reading necessary to pick carefully through the staggering amount of information available today in print and digitally and actively seek the wide, deep, and thoughtful engagement with high-quality informational texts that builds knowledge, enlarges experience, and broadens worldviews. They reflexively demonstrate the cogent reasoning and use of evidence that is essential to both private deliberation and responsible citizenship in a democratic republic.

In short, students who exceed the Standards develop the skills in reading, writing, speaking, and listening that are the foundation for any creative and purposeful expression. The Bolton Central School District believes that this better prepares our students for success after graduation. The Common Core Standards will be implemented fully and endorsed across our entire curriculum in the years to come.

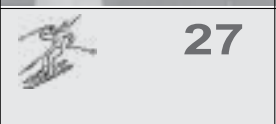

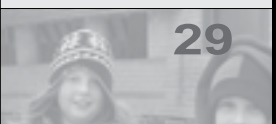

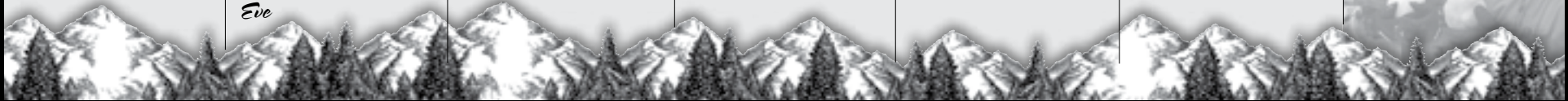

RULES FOR ATTENDING ATHLETIC CONTESTS

Please follow these rules:

1. At all athletic contests, coaches and advisors will be in charge of cheerleaders and players.
2. Chaperones from both home and visiting schools attending the activity will have full charge of spectators.
3. Visiting teams, spectators and referees are guests. Sportsmanlike conduct will be the responsibility of each member of the faculty, student body, and Bolton fans.
4. Students are not to leave their seats except between games and at halftime.
5. Students attending from Grade 6 or below must be accompanied by a parent (or adult) and remain with that parent (or adult) during the game (a student is not considered an adult for the purpose of this rule).
6. Refreshments will be served and consumed in the cafeteria at the following times: pregame, halftime, and intermission between games.
7. Smoking is strictly prohibited on school property.
8. Only those in uniform will be allowed on the playing surface at any time. Spectators are asked to avoid this area entirely.

9. Students are not allowed to leave the building and then reenter without prior permission. Once a student leaves the building, he/she may not be permitted to return.

10. Only players, coaches and managers will be allowed in the locker rooms. Others found there will be directed to leave.

11. Students and spectators will have access to bathrooms on the first floor only. These are located in the hallway adjacent to the gym.

12. Cordial host behavior is a reflection on Bolton Central School.

13. Spectators are not to be in the building outside the gymnasium area.

14. Spectators are to be seated and not stand in doorways.

It is important that we maintain our reputation as good hosts, good sports, and good spectators. No booing at any time. When foul shots are taken by any team, silence is the policy.

If a visiting teams' players or spectators conduct themselves poorly, exert every effort to maintain a calm and cool manner. We have chaperones at basketball games, who constantly remind the crowd of the need to be good sports, but they cannot do it alone. All of us become part of the process.

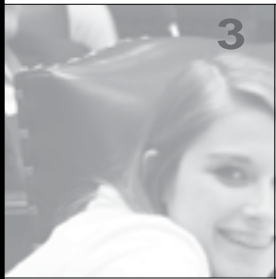

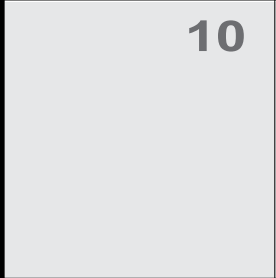

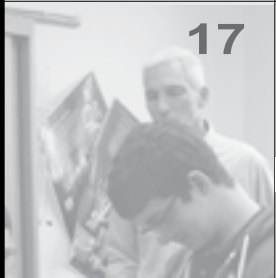

Bolton Central School offers breakfast to all students. Breakfast is served each school day beginning at 7:45 a.m. Cost is \$1.75. All menu items meet or exceed nutritional guidelines as determined by NYS and Federal Programs. Reduced breakfast price 25¢.

SCHOOL LUNCH

Bolton Central School serves nutritionally complete lunches every school day. In addition to a complete lunch, students may purchase any part of the lunch on an a-la-carte basis. Regular lunch may be purchased for \$2.25. Additional milk may also be purchased separately for 50¢.

Children from households that meet federal income guidelines are eligible for free or reduced price lunches. The cost of a reduced price lunch is 25¢. Please contact Donna DiPietro, the School Nurse, at 644-2400 ext. 106 for information. Applying is simple and confidential.

School may be closed at any time of year due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances. When school is closed or dismissed early, all extracurricular activities and events for the remainder of that day and evening are also canceled, unless otherwise announced.

We are aware that emergency closings are often unexpected and parents may not be home to receive children. Thus, once school is in session we make every effort to stay open. In the event of a closing, we also want to make certain the Town Highway Department has the opportunity to properly clear and sand roads for buses and individuals picking up children at school.

Should school not open due to emergency or weather conditions, or in the event of a delayed opening or an early dismissal, the radio and television stations listed here will carry important information for you. Parents of BCS students who have completed the necessary information during registration, will receive a phone call from the BCS Alert Telephone Notification System.

STUDENT INSURANCE

All student related, supervised activities are covered by an "excess coverage" student accident insurance plan. Claims for an injury must be submitted by the parents or guardians to their own health insurance carrier first. If the claim is not payable or is in excess of the amount payable, the balance is then submitted for supplemental payment under the school plan.

For any supervised school accident which requires medical attention, parents should notify the School Nurse. Failure on the part of the parent to meet certain clerical obligations, which are vital to the claim process, may result in unnecessary delays in payment of valid claims. Even if you are fairly certain your family insurance will cover a claim, the School Nurse should be notified.

INFORMATION ON DISPENSING MEDICATION

In order to comply with New York State Regulations, the following procedures must be followed for all students requiring medication during school hours:

- A written physician's order to administer the medication must be provided to the Health Office.
- Signed written parental/guardian consent to administer the medication must be on file in the Health Office.
- The medication must be brought to the Health Office by the parent/guardian in the original labeled container including prescribed and over-the-counter (OTC) medications. Medications not in their original containers will not be accepted.
- The above orders are for both prescribed and over-the-counter medications including Tylenol, Advil, cough/cold medicines, etc.
- Students are NOT permitted to carry any medications (prescribed and/or OTCs) with them during school at any time.

Exceptions in special circumstances are students requiring inhalers and/or emergency medications such as epi-pen. A signed written order from the physician and parent/guardian for permission for self-administration is required in these special cases. Permission to allow these students to carry their medication is at the discretion of the Health Office.

If you have any questions regarding medications in the school setting, please contact the school nurse during regular school hours.
