What's unique for these students is that they've lived in three decades, two centuries and two millenniums.

They began kindergarten in 2000 and Britney Spears has always been heard on classic rock stations during their lifetime. These high school graduates came of age in a world of global connectivity, where time spent on the Internet often exceeded time spent watching television. Apple launched the iPod in 2001, You Tube started in 2005 and Twitter in 2006. Broadband Internet, mobile phones, digital cameras, MP3 players, email, and the management of one's social life via networking software became necessities for younger Americans.

As a result of growing up with the Internet and associated devices, millennials are often said to be the most technologically savvy generation to date.

They have witnessed terrorist attacks on America, school shootings, war, hurricanes, tornadoes, and man-eating sinkholes. They have never needed a set of bound encyclopedias and prefer to watch television everywhere except on a television. They have seen a woman lead the U.S. State Department for most of their lives and can carry school books – those that are not on their e-Readers – in backpacks that roll.

According to the U.S. census bureau, around 40 percent of the millennial generation is African American, Latino, Asian or of a racially-mixed background.

There are about 76 million millennials in the United States (based on research using the years 1978-2000).


Twenty percent have at least one immigrant parent.

A number of studies, including one by the Center for American Progress, anticipate that millennials will be the first American generation to do less well economically than their parents.

Millennial pop stars and rock bands include: Rihanna, Taylor Swift, Avril Lavigne, Ashlee Simpson, Chris Brown, T-Pain, Fall Out Boy, and Panic at the Disco. From England, meanwhile, hail Arctic Monkeys, Lily Allen, and Kate Nash. Starting in 2006, tween pop acts like the Jonas Brothers started to enter the mainstream from Radio Disney. During the 2000s, hip hop surpassed rock as the most popular musical genre with American youth. Blockbuster movies have included: "The Lord of the Rings" series, the "Harry Potter" series, and computer-animated films such as "Shrek" and "The Incredibles." Video games like "Guitar Hero," "Rockband," "Grand Theft Auto," "Halo," and "Madden" dominated. Downloading ringtones became a multibillion-dollar business.



In addition to the Booster Club Scholarships and the Senior Awards, which are awarded to Bolton students when they graduate, Bolton students have the opportunity to receive cash grants from the Bolton Scholarship Association after they graduate

opportunity to receive cash grants from the Bolton Scholarship Association after they graduate and go on to college.

The Bolton Scholarship Committee met this spring and awarded 20 new scholarships to deserving alumni from Bolton Central School. The total amount disbursed this year was \$5,050.

Originally established as a loan-giving group, the Scholarship Committee now grants the scholarships outright to deserving Bolton graduates. The Class of 2013 will be eligible to apply for scholarships when they complete their first semester of college.

Students must submit a college transcript and have a GPA of at least 2.50 to qualify. Awards are granted to students attending two-year and four-year colleges and technical/trade schools.

The Bolton Scholarship Committee makes the grants from its endowment fund, and awards are based on the annual interest earned by this fund. This keeps the scholarship fund self-sustaining.




