Alumni Receive Scholarships, Too

Scholarship Association provides awards to former Bolton students who are enrolled in college.

In addition to the Booster Club Scholarships and the Senior Awards, which are awarded to Bolton students when they graduate, Bolton students have the opportunity to receive cash grants

from the Bolton Scholarship Association after they graduate and go on to college.

The Bolton Scholarship Committee met this spring and awarded 20 new scholarships to deserving alumni from Bolton Central School. The total amount disbursed this year was \$1,280.

Originally established as a loan-giving group, the Scholarship Committee now grants the scholarships outright to deserving Bolton graduates. The Class of 2014 will be eligible to apply for scholarships when they complete their first semester of college.

Students must submit a college transcript and have a GPA of at least 2.50 to qualify. Awards are granted to students attending two-year and four-year colleges and technical/trade schools.

The Bolton Scholarship Committee makes the grants from its endowment fund, and awards are based on the annual interest earned by this fund. This keeps the scholarship fund self-sustaining.



The Class of 2014 is also the first class to enjoy the fully renovated Bolton Central School upon their arrival as kindergarteners. As students, they never experienced the "Balcony" in the gym, The "GP" room or starting lunch periods at 10:30 in the morning.

As they progressed through the grades as Bolton students, they learned about such events as the Columbia Space Shuttle disaster, which halted U.S. space exploration for over 2 years. As part of their Social Studies education, the class realized that the USA invasion of Iraq was paramount in their studies. A little later on, an event occurred which would affect all of them, particularly as they got older as "Facebook" was introduced to our society.

The most catastrophic science event during their elementary years was the US landfall of Hurricane Katrina on the Gulf Coast. The class didn't realize at first that this would also turn into a wonderful lesson about humanity. Class members soon became involved with their older peers in many efforts to assist those who were devastated by the storm. These lessons would become even more valuable when as high schoolers, Super Storm Sandy made an impact much closer to home.

Many events shaped the educational paths of each graduate but the class proceeds being a group that is diverse and ready to meet the future prepared to live each of their lives as graduates of Bolton Central School.
