



IMPROVEMENT INITIATIVES


As a result of the 2013 Strategic Planning Initiative, Bolton Central School continues to develop and implement annual improvement plans. Focus areas for the 2018 – 2019 school year include:

School Safety at Bolton Central School

We take the safety of our students, staff and visitors very seriously. It takes all staff members, students, parents and visitors cooperating and working together to ensure that our school continues to be the safest environment possible. Please note the following procedures for keeping our school a safe place for everyone.



Students can do the following to help ensure our school is safe:

- If you see something, say something.
- Stand up for classmates who are being harassed or bullied. At the very least, notify Mr. Shippee or another adult if there is an issue.
- Follow the school's safety procedures and ask others to do the same.
- Be kind to classmates.

- All visitors must enter through the main entrance by the softball field. Visitors will be required to sign in at the entry office. Visitors must use the buzzer to gain entrance into the school building.
- If the office staff does not recognize you, you may be asked about your identity and business at the school through an
- Parents/guardians picking up students for dismissal will not be permitted beyond the entry office until 2:45 pm. Please do not wait in the entry vestibule. Proceed into the main office or wait outside. All students being picked up should be met by a parent/ guardian in the cafeteria.
- During regular school hours, students and staff will not prop any doors and will not open doors for visitors.
- The school employs the help of security cameras on the exterior of the building and in hallways, entrances, the cafeteria and the gymnasium.
- Law enforcement officers are regularly present in the building and on the District grounds. However, this does not necessarily mean that there is a problem. Do not be alarmed when officers are present. The school has a strong relationship with the New York State Troopers, the Warren County Sheriff's Department, and the Bolton Police Department.
- The district Safety Committee meets monthly to review procedures and safety issues in and around the school.

EMERGENCY CLOSINGS

School may be closed at any time of year due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances. When school is closed or dismissed early, all extracurricular activities and events for the remainder of that day and evening are also canceled, unless otherwise announced.

We are aware that emergency closings are often unexpected and parents may not be home to receive children. Once school is in session we make every effort to stay open. In the event of a closing, we also want to make certain the Town Highway Department has the opportunity to properly clear and sand roads for buses and individuals picking up children at school.

Should school not open due to emergency or weather conditions, or in the event of a delayed opening or an early dismissal, the radio and television stations listed here will carry important information for you. STUDENT INSURANCE

All student related, supervised activities are covered by our supplemental student accident insurance policy. Claims for injury must be submitted by the parents or guardians' to their own health insurance carrier first. If the claim is not payable or is in excess of the amount payable, the balance is then submitted for supplemental payment under the school policy.

DISPENSING MEDICATION

If you require any medication, prescription and/or over the counter that must be taken during school hours, we require documentation from your doctor stating your name, the name of the medication and prescribing information including frequency and dosage. The medication must be brought to the Health Office by your parent/guardian in the original container and will remain locked in the Health Office, where the School Nurse will retrieve it for you as appropriate.

Students that have been deemed self-directed by their doctor and the school nurse may be allowed to carry their own inhalers.

If you have any questions regarding medications in the school setting, please contact the school nurse during regular school hours.

RULES FOR ATTENDING ATHLETIC CONTESTS

Please follow these rules:

- 1. At all athletic contests, coaches and advisors will be in charge of cheerleaders and players.
- 2. Chaperones from both home and visiting schools attending the activity will have full charge of spectators.
- 3. Visiting teams, spectators and referees are guests. Sportsmanlike conduct will be the responsibility of each member of the faculty, student body, and Bolton fans.
- 4. Students are not to leave their seats except between games and at halftime.
- 5. Students attending from Grade 6 or below must be accompanied by a parent (or adult) and remain with that parent (or adult) during the game (a student is not considered an adult for the purpose of this rule).
- 6. Refreshments will be served and consumed in the cafeteria at the following times: pregame, halftime, and intermission between
- 7. Smoking is strictly prohibited on school property.
- 8. Only those in uniform will be allowed on the playing surface at any time. Spectators are asked to avoid this area entirely.
- 9. Students are not allowed to leave the building and then reenter without prior permission. Once a student leaves the building, he/ she may not be permitted to return.
- 10. Only players, coaches and managers will be allowed in the locker rooms. Others found there will be directed to leave.

- 11. Students and spectators will have access to bathrooms on the first floor only. These are located in the hallway adjacent to the gym.
- 12. Cordial host behavior is a reflection on Bolton Central School.
- 13. Spectators are not to be in the building outside the gymnasium
- 14. Spectators are to be seated and not stand in doorways.

In addition, Bolton Central School supports and encourages spectators to enjoy the competition between our student-athletes and cheer for our teams in a positive manner. Spectators should "Be Loud, Be Proud, Be Positive" toward players, coaches, officials, and other spectators.

At BCS, we want to set good examples for our students and be supportive of our teams. We will be working with our chaperones to develop consistency with our expectations and will be forming a Sportsmanship Review committee to address inappropriate behavior of spectators, should it arise.

We hope you agree that interscholastic athletics should be about the student-athletes, and we do not want to take away the positive experience participating in the athletic program provides.

BCS is working in partnership with the New York State Public High School Athletic Association in supporting and encouraging spectators to enjoy the competition between our student-athletes and cheer for their teams in a positive manner.

SCHOOL BREAKFAST



Bolton Central School serves nutritionally complete lunches every school day. In addition to a complete lunch, students may purchase any part of the lunch on an a-la-carte basis. Regular lunch may be purchased for \$2.65. Additional milk may also be purchased separately for 50¢.

SCHOOL BUS SAFETY RULES & PROCEDURES

The most important element of school bus transportation is the safety of students. In order to achieve a safe and efficient system, drivers must have the cooperation of all student riders. All BCS bus drivers are responsible for the operation of the bus and for the appropriate behavior of students while riding on the school bus. Parents remain responsible for the behavior of students until they are boarded onto the school bus. Students are expected to always follow the Bus Safety Rules. This means that at all times students will comply with instructions from the bus driver.

Incidents of misbehavior will be reported to the Administration and can result in your loss of bus riding privileges. Students may be given assigned seating on any bus run.

Remember that the Bolton Central School District cooperates fully with the New York State Department of Transportation and Education Department. We are a member school for "Operation Safe Stop". Under normal circumstances you will enter and exit the bus so as not to cross traffic on busy or potentially dangerous roads.

The following rules and regulations are in place for all bus riders:

Waiting for the Bus

- * Be on time! Plan to be ready to board as soon as the bus arrives.
- * Wait off the road surface.
- * Always watch the bus as it comes to a stop.

Arrival of the Bus

- * Stand still until the bus has completely stopped.
- * Board the bus safely, quickly and quietly.
- * Sit as the bus driver directs you.
- * Seat belt use is suggested for student safety.
- * Please do not act in any manner that will cause the bus driver to take his/her eyes from the roadway or mirrors.

While the Bus is Moving

- * Remain seated and sit quietly so you can hear directives from the driver if need be.
- * While the bus is moving, you must not do anything that will disturb or distract the driver or cause harm.





This includes:

No swearing, abusive or vulgar language or gestures

No hitting, touching or harassing riders

Fighting is NEVER allowed and will not be tolerated

Keep arms and head inside windows at all times. Only open a window after getting approval from the driver. Do not shout or gesture out of a window.

Hold all books and belongings or place them securely under your seat

Always know the location of the nearest emergency
